Two years ago, I took on the transformation of our conversations about mental health; today I am someone who is recognized and sought after for that contribution. In registering accomplishment, we become available to see things we were not able to see and say things we were not able to say; we have new opportunities to play, to add existence and membership, and to restore and create integrity.

This year we invite you to submit a paper, poster, Report from the Field, breakout session or artwork based on your experience living in the world where the commitments you have created are alive, unfolding and developing. Ideal topics are those that acknowledge, celebrate, and strengthen your creations, as well as share the possibilities and futures you can now see and develop.

Papers—Submissions close October 1, 2020

Journal papers provide authors with an opportunity to articulate their research, inquiries, ideas, practices, philosophies, views, work, artistic endeavors, successes and failures on topics related to the theme of the conference as expressed in this Call for Papers. Submissions must be completed drafts of original work, no longer than 5,000 words. Papers are reviewed by an editorial committee and publication in the Journal of the Conference for Global Transformation may be subject to recommended revisions.

Awards. The authors of the top papers will be invited to present at the conference; presenters are expected to attend the conference as registered participants. To submit your paper, go to WisdomCGT.com, click on "Play a Key Role" and choose "Write a Journal Paper." A more comprehensive guide for authors is available there. You will be advised of acceptance by November 18, 2020.

Discoveries from the Inquiries. If you have participated in one or more of the Inquiries of the Social Commons, we invite you to submit a paper or Report from the Field. You could report on what you, or your group, have discovered, encountered or want to contribute from your inquiries. Follow the guidelines for writing a paper or submitting a Report from the Field.

Reports from the Field—Submissions close January 15, 2021

A Report from the Field is an opportunity to contribute to others by sharing about living with, and engaging in, your commitments for the world. We invite you to submit a report of up to 1,500 words about what you have discovered, accomplished or learned regarding your commitments. Workshops—Submissions close October 1, 2020

Workshops, typically led by one to three people, are intended to have participants investigate topics related to the theme of the conference. Successful sessions tend to include inquiry and provide access to new contexts, thinking, ideas, practices and performance regarding matters the session leaders

and participants care about, are committed to, or wish to make real in the world.

Panel Sessions have three or more people giving short presentations on topics related to the theme of the conference. The presentations may be followed by questions, discussion or inquiry.

Eligibility. Each workshop or panel session presenter must be a Wisdom Unlimited graduate who has attended the Conference for Global Transformation as a registered participant at least once.

You will be advised of acceptance by November 18, 2020. All breakout session presenters are expected to attend the conference as registered participants.

Posters—Submissions close March 1, 2021, or when capacity is reached.

It is an opportunity to display whatever you are at work on and a great way to talk about things you have discovered, learned or accomplished, including issues you are encountering or ideas you have. Artists for Global Transformation— Submissions close January 15, 2021
