My first job after completing my Ph.D. was with Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation, the premier research organization in Australia. I was introverted, a thinker and, let us be honest, socially insensitive. I was always overprepared for meetings, and I'd arrive with five to 10 pages of solutions to agenda items. I would walk into those meetings with these important scientists, present my solutions; and no one listened. I was talking to myself. I wasn't with them or interested in them; I was only interested in my solutions. You could say I wasn't sharing. What I learned from these early interactions is that authentic sharing is an important part of breaking through to participate in creating solutions.

Another story: I'm married to a wonderful person and I've always been amazed at her ability to share with others. When she travels on the commuter train, she will frequently have a conversation with somebody, anybody. Often, sharing happens. There are many times she has brought someone she met on the train home for dinner, so they can meet our friends. I ask, "Who are they?" She replies, "I met them on the train. They were speaking Spanish; I spoke Spanish back to them. They are newly in Australia so I thought we might as well have a Spanish-speaking dinner." So far as I can tell, it's in the sharing that we celebrate being, and it's in sharing that I get to love my wife for being herself.

In exploring the power of sharing, I discovered my own success, my love for my wife, and that I am only at the beginning of an inquiry into sharing: moments of creating where I get to be really alive and experience the miraculous nature of the world.

I look forward to exploring and discovering the wonder of sharing with you this year. We invite you to submit a paper or other contribution for the 2026 Conference for Global Transformation that speaks to sharing and sharing's relationship to the fulfillment of your commitment for the world.

# JOURNAL CONTRIBUTIONS

#### **Papers**

Submissions close September 1, 2025

Authors must be registered for the 2026 conference before submitting a paper for the Journal of the Conference for Global Transformation. Journal papers provide authors with an opportunity to articulate their research, inquiries, ideas, practices, philosophies, views, work, artistic endeavors, successes, and failures on topics related to the theme of the conference as expressed in this Call for Papers & Other Contributions. Submissions must be completed drafts of original work (with proper documentation when drawing on the ideas of others). The body of the paper should be no longer than 5,000 words. If a paper is submitted that is longer than 5,000 words, the editor may choose to return it without it being reviewed. Papers are reviewed by an editorial committee, and publication in the Journal of the Conference for Global Transformation may be subject to recommended revisions. You will be advised of acceptance by October 18, 2025.

**Awards.** The authors of the three top papers will be invited to present a joint workshop at the conference.

#### Workshops

Submissions close September 1, 2025

Workshops, typically led by one to three people, are intended to have participants investigate topics related to the theme of the conference. Successful sessions tend to include inquiry and provide access to new contexts, thinking, ideas, practices, and performance regarding matters the session leaders and participants care about, are committed to, or wish to make real in the world. Workshops can also be panel presentations with three to six people giving short presentations on topics related to the theme of the conference. The presentations may be followed by questions, discussion, or inquiry.

**Eligibility.** Each workshop or panel session presenter must have attended the Conference for Global Transformation as a registered participant at least once prior and be registered for the 2026 conference before submitting a workshop proposal. Individual Submissions close January 15, 2026
